



Included in the box is the MagMod MagGrip, the MagGrid, the MagShpere and a carry bag.

The MagGrip is made of silicone rubber and stretches over the head of most flash systems. It houses 2 powerful magnets for quickly attaching the various MagMod accessories.

The MagGrid controls light spill and narrows your flash's beam angle to 40 degrees. It also has 2 magnets that easily attach to the MagGrip.

The MagSphere softens and diffuses the light from your flash and again houses 2 magnets for easy attachment. It also has an intergrated gel spot for adjusting the colour of your flash (gels not included).
