Education Night Photography 101

Although primarily aimed at new photographers, the workshop can also be a valuable refresher for those more experienced in the craft.

PHOTO WALK: WRECK OF THE OMEO

The wreck of the Omeo lies in four metres of water just 40 metres from shore at Coogee Beach.

Built in Newcastle, England, in 1858, the 605-ton barque-rigged steamer spent many years ferrying passengers and cargo between Melbourne, Adelaide and New Zealand before sailing to Darwin in 1870. There it chartered to contractors who were completing the northern section of the Overland Telegraph line which would connect Australia to Great Britain.

In 1895 the Omeo ran aground at Hamelin Bay while loading timber. After it was refloated the ship was sent to Fremantle and used as a hulk.

On September 12, 1905, the Omeo slipped its moorings and drifted onto the beach near Woodmans Point.

Upcoming Topics

The topic for **OCTOBER** is "Nature – International Competition Rules".

Images of our natural environment. Subjects in this category include animals, plants, landscape, seascape and astrophotography. They can include native and feral subjects but not domesticated or farmed ones. Techniques include aerial and macro photography.

Image processing shall be minimal. Stacking of multiple images (exposure bracketing, focus stack and panorama) is acceptable, only if they are all taken without moving the camera. Except for minor cleaning, altering elements in the image including removal of distractions, warping, shrinking or enlarging the subject are not permitted. Acceptable adjustments include dodging, burning, levels, curves, sharpening and noise reduction.

The topic for **NOVEMBER** is "Mandurah – Be A Photographer Of Your Own City".

The wreck now forms part of the Coogee Maritime Trail. Only the stern post and a section of the collapsed bow triangle can be seen above the water.

SEPTEMBER APPRAISAL

The topic for September was Noongar Season, Djilba, and the judge for the night was Colin White. Colin is a founding president and life member of the Western Australian Photographic Judges Association.



He believes photography clubs are about art. Like with all art judging is subjective. When appraising, judges are looking for impact and an image may affect each of them differently. Colin explained how fifty percent of an assessment is based on message and meaning (strong visual communication). The other half involves artistic content and mastery of medium (technical skill).

Twenty-nine images were entered for appraisal (19 Open and 10 Topic). Nine of the submissions were prints. Colin awarded 2 Gold, 7 Silver and 15 Bronze across all categories.
